Discussion	<p>The Board deliberated on the importance of integrating SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) and other online MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) offered through government portals such as UGC, AICTE, NPTEL, IGNOU, and CEC into the undergraduate and postgraduate curriculum.</p> <p>It was observed that these platforms provide access to high-quality learning resources, flexibility in learning, and exposure to courses designed by eminent scholars and institutions of national importance. The adoption of such courses is also in alignment with the directives of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the National Education Policy (NEP 2020), which encourage integration of online learning to promote academic flexibility, multidisciplinary learning, and lifelong education.</p> <p>The Board further discussed the framework for implementation, including:</p>

The members acknowledged that these subjects hold immense importance in inculcating values of national consciousness, cultural identity, and holistic understanding of India's intellectual traditions. Discussion	<p>The Board reviewed the <i>Annual Stakeholder Feedback Report on Curriculum</i> for the Academic Year 2024–2025, compiled by the Department of Liberal Arts & Humanities, Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences. The report included responses and suggestions from students, teachers, employers, alumni, and professionals.</p> <p>Key points of discussion included:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Students' Feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Majority of students rated the curriculum as “Excellent” (63.33%) and “Good” (24.75%). Suggestions included revising syllabus as per industry needs, more value-added courses, preparation for competitive exams, and greater industry exposure through visits and workshops. The Board appreciated these suggestions and emphasized the importance of aligning curriculum with employability skills. Teachers' Feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers highlighted the need to strengthen learning infrastructure, update library resources, and organize sessions on emerging tools and methodologies. The Board agreed on increasing titles in the library and conducting Faculty Development Workshops on digital tools and industry-relevant teaching practices. Employers' Feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Employers emphasized the need for improved skill development, field-based knowledge, and training activities. The Board resolved to establish centres of excellence, conduct more hands-on sessions, and arrange industry expert lectures. Alumni Feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Alumni rated the curriculum very positively (over 91% excellent). Their key suggestions included offering more subject choices, focusing on communication and personal development, and arranging more industry exposure. The Board noted that modifications in the current academic year have already expanded subject offerings, and resolved to add more PDP sessions and interactive workshops. Professional Feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Professionals recommended enhancing interdisciplinary exposure, increasing field-based learning, and encouraging student research publications. The Board supported initiatives such as compulsory NGO internships, rural/urban surveys, joint seminars, and guiding students for national paper presentations.




