



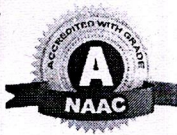

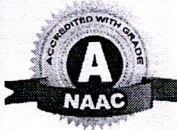

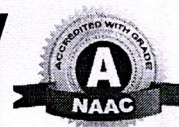

The Board also resolved that periodic review and updation of the curriculum shall be undertaken to ensure academic relevance and quality enhancement.



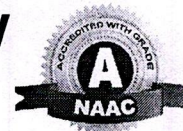

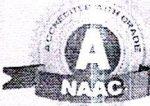
